## Re: Revised design for 11-19 Jane Street, Manhattan

Dear Chair Srinivasan:

The Preservation Committee of the Greenwich Village Society for Historic Preservation has reviewed the revised proposed design for 11-19 Jane Street. We feel strongly that the revised design does not rise to the level of "appropriate" for the Greenwich Village Historic District, and should not be approved as is.

Unfortunately, the changes made to the design do not address some of the fundamental problems with this proposed design. The design continues to appear repetitive, bland, and dull, and still very much resembles the look of a chain motel. Our committee was especially concerned with the blandness of the ground floor. Even looking towards other designs by the same architect, we thought that wood surrounds for the windows and doors and greenery at the ground floor would improve the warmth and texture of the design.

While the small decrease in the height of the penthouse is a step in the right direction, we continue to feel that a smaller overall scale for the building would be more appropriate, again looking towards the four-story neighbors of the building.

The proposed changes really tinker with the edges of the design rather than rethinking some of its basic problems. We urge you to ask the applicant to reconsider the design, as was done after the July public meeting, rather than simply adjust a few details, in order to make it an appropriate addition to this street and to the Greenwich Village Historic District.
