



In this building, the first female doctor in America, Elizabeth Blackwell, established the first hospital for, staffed, and run by women. The New York Infirmary for Women and Children opened on May 12, 1857, a date which was also the birthday of Blackwell's friend and collaborator Florence Nightingale. Groundbreaking at the time, the hospital provided free medical care for indigent women and children, and offered clinical experience and instruction for women determined to expand their skills as physicians.





CITY COUNCIL PRIMARIES ARE SEPT. 12 FIND OUT WHERE THE CANDIDATES STAND AND VOTE!



Primary elections for City Council Districts 1 and 2 will be held on Tuesday, September 12 (there is no contested primary for the Council District 3 seat). Such primaries often determine who wins, so it's vital to educate yourself about the candidates and vote.



Last Minute Push in Albany to Allow Supersized Buildings in Residential NYC Neighborhoods



As the legislative session nears the end in Albany, there is a renewed push to repeal the State cap on the size of residential buildings in NYC. Although enormous new residential buildings are going up all over NYC, including many of 1,000 feet in height or greater, this is not enough for proponents of lifting the cap, who want no limit whatsoever. This would allow the Mayor to upzone residential neighborhoods throughout New York City, promoting an evermore massive scale of development that would largely consist of luxury, market-rate housing.

We have defeated two attempts by this coalition to repeal the cap – in 2016 and earlier this year when they tried to sneak it into the State budget. However, much as GVSHP predicted, they are at it again, trying to see the repeal passed in the last weeks of the legislative session, without public hearings or analysis (it's already passed one Senate committee).



P.S. 64 Developer Files Federal Lawsuit, Claiming Conspiracy to Block Dorm Plan

Developer Gregg Singer has filed a federal lawsuit in his continuing battle to create a student dormitory at the former P.S. 64 building on East Ninth Street.

In the lawsuit, the Wall Street Journal (subscription required) reports, Singer is claiming a conspiracy by local elected officials, a powerful neighbor (Aaron Sosnick) and the Greenwich Village Society for Historic Preservation, a vocal opponent of the development plans.

In 1998, the city sold the building to Singer for \$3.3 million, a move that eventually lead to the eviction of the CHARAS/El Bohio Community Center. The Department of Buildings has declined to approve construction permits, saying that the developer has, "failed to submit sufficient proof that the building would be used as a student dormitory." Former City Councilmember Rosie Mendez was a fierce opponent of the dorm plan. Singer campaigned against Carlina Rivera this past fall, who was elected to succeed Mendez in the City Council.
