Description: A Greek Revival style rowhouse built in 1845. Application is to construct a rooftop addition and alter a rear

addition.

COMMISSION FINDINGS

Pursuant to Section 25-307 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, the Commission APPROVED the proposal, finding:

- -that the proposed work will not eliminate any significant historic architectural features or be visible from any public thoroughfares;
- -that the rooftop addition will be set back from the front and rear façades and the rear addition will not extend to the top floor of the building, maintaining a sense of the building's original massing;
- -that the existing rear addition will only be modestly enlarged and its projection will approximate the depth of the rear additions at adjacent properties, therefore, it will not diminish the central greenspace;
- -that the rear addition will feature a solid to void ratio and horizontal band between floor levels which will be compatible with the residential scale and character of this rowhouse;
- -and that the work will not diminish the special historic and architectural character of the Greenwich Village Historic District.
