COMMISSION FINDINGS

The Commission NOTED that the building's style, scale, materials, and details are among the features that contribute to the special architectural and historic character of the NoHo Historic District Extension.

Pursuant to Section 25-307 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, the Commission APPROVED WITH MODIFICATIONS, finding:

-that the proposed illuminated signage, consisting of halo-lit metal signs with a black finish, installed onto the brick spandrels above the storefront entries, will not overwhelm the building or detract from the streetscape; -and that the presence of stretch banner signage at the 2nd floor of this commercial building will not detract from the building or the streetscape.

However, in voting to grant this approval, the Commission REQUIRED:

-that only one banner sign be installed, at the Lafayette Street façade only, in consultation with staff; -and that the banner sign be reduced in size by greatly reducing the black border.
