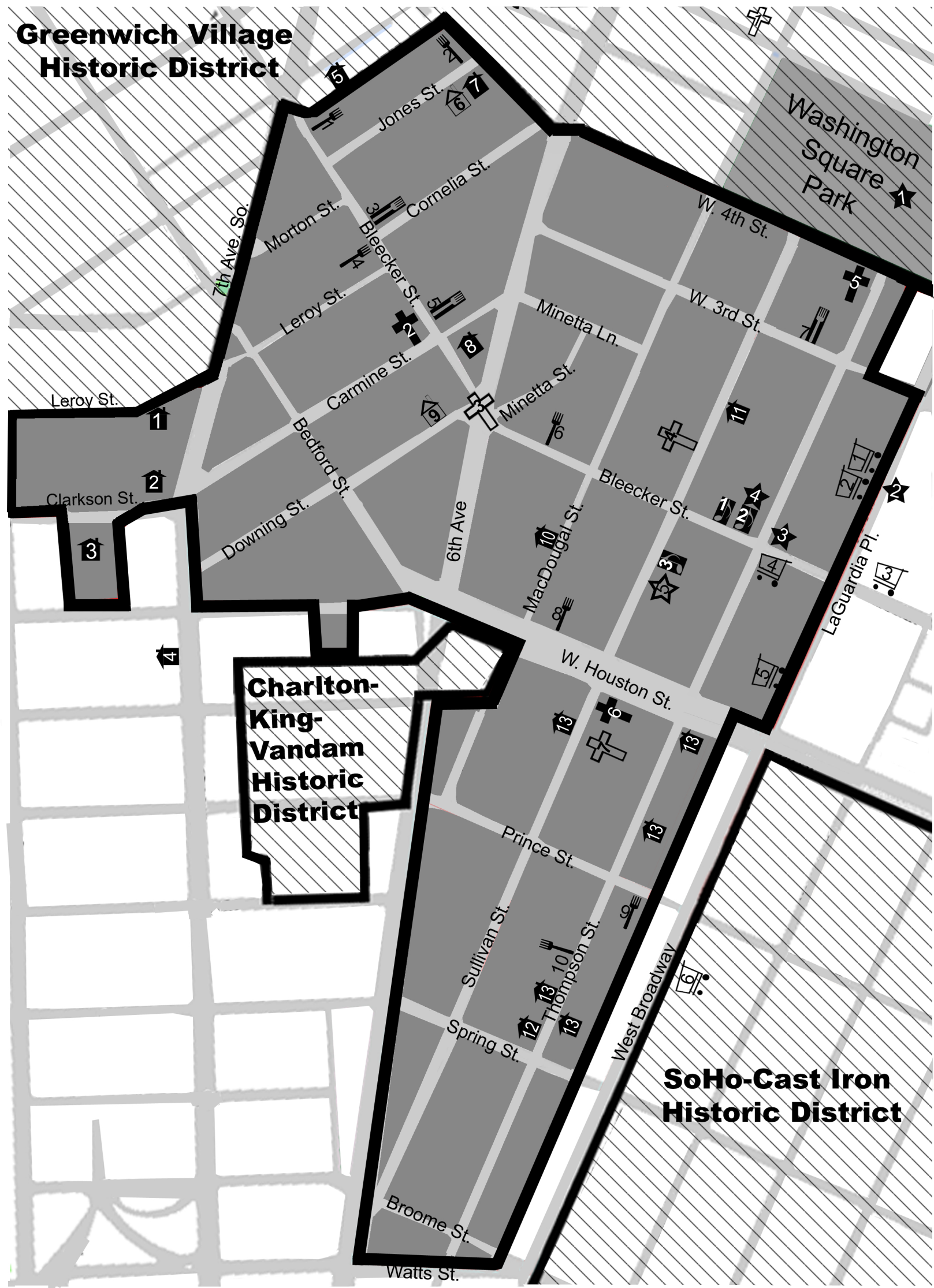


SITES IN THE ITALIAN-AMERICAN SOUTH VILLAGE
