

Vote on Plan for 11-Story Undulating Glass Tower at 13th and Greenwich Avenue Expected Soon

On Tuesday, March 7th, the Landmarks Preservation Commission held a hearing on the proposed design for 122 Greenwich Avenue. Dozens of people showed up to testify, almost all in opposition. **BUT IT IS STILL POSSIBLE THAT THE COMMISSION MAY APPROVE THE DESIGN AS IS, SO IT IS CRITICAL THAT THEY HEAR FROM YOU BEFORE THEY VOTE.**

The Greenwich Village Society for Historic Preservation is urging the Landmarks Preservation Commission to disapprove the proposed undulating glass design for 122 Greenwich Avenue unless it is changed to better reflect the historic character and architecture of the neighborhood. We are very concerned about the precedent this design would set as well as the visual impact it would have at this especially prominent site.
