COMMISSION FINDINGS

The Commission NOTED that the building's style, scale, material, and details are among the features that contribute to the special architectural and historic character of the East Village/Lower East Side Historic District.

Pursuant to Section 25-307 of the Adminstrative Code of the City of New York, the Commission APPROVED the proposal, finding:

-that the bracket will be placed in the lowest practical location above the first floor storefront to meet Department of Buildings regulations and will avoid any penetration into the historic decorative cornice;

-that the bracket sign will be installed at plain masonry;

-that the sign will be in close proximity to the commercial space it advertises;

-that the sign will be in keeping with signage historically found at storefronts at buildings of this type, style, and age, throughout the historic district, in terms of its materials, size, and design;

-and that the sign will not overwhelm the building or detract from any significant architectural features of the building or streetscape.
