Information about today's hearing:

Thank you for attending today's important public hearing on a zoning text amendment submitted by the Department of City Planning. This text amendment, Mandatory Inclusionary Housing, would require that developers include affordable housing in areas that are rezoned for more housing development. This program would apply only in certain parts of the city, though none of these areas have been formally designated yet.

Representatives of City agencies will first make a presentation on the proposal. This will be followed by a question and answer session by Council Members. Public testimony will likely not occur before 11:30 AM.

General Guidelines

- Please do not speak while others are addressing the Council Members. We would like to ensure that each speaker can be heard and transcribed accurately. Please be respectful of others.
- No clapping is allowed. Support can be indicated by waving hands in the air in a gesture similar to jazz hands or the American Sign Language gesture for applause.
- No food is allowed inside Council Chambers.
- If you require translation or any other assistance, please alert a Sergeant-at-Arms.

Testimony Procedures

- If you would like to speak make sure to fill out a speaker slip.
- Everyone will have a total of **three** minutes to speak on both items. While the focus of today's hearing is Mandatory Inclusionary Housing, testimony on Zoning for Quality and Affordability can be given. Please be respectful of the time limit as it will help as ensure that as many people are able to speak as possible.
- Please listen for your name. The Chair may call the names of several speakers at once. Do not approach the speaker's table until your name is called. Speak clearly and identify yourself and the group you represent.
- Speakers will be called in the order in which they sign up, with the exception that elected officials will be given priority. The first five speakers in favor will be heard and given the opportunity to conclude their testimony before the next five speakers in opposition are heard. The hearing will proceed in this manner until all speakers present have had an opportunity to be heard.
- You must be present when your name is called to speak to provide testimony.
