## Re: 43 MacDougal Street, Charlton-King-Vandam Historic District

Dear Chair Tierney,

I write to you regarding the unoccupied 1846 townhouse at 43 MacDougal Street, located within the Charlton-King-Vandam Historic District. In its abandoned state, this building has posed a health and safety threat for years, and has continued to deteriorate from vandalism, exposure to the elements, and lack of basic maintenance. We have worked to see this landmark restored before neglect allows too much of its historic integrity to be compromised.

Today, the building continues to deteriorate. The rear façade is settling, threatening the building's stability. Problems related to graffiti and rodents persist, and homeless people continue to take refuge under the sidewalk shed.

News of the sale of the building on September 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2011, however, presents an opportunity. According to our research, the purchaser owns dozens of buildings throughout the city and has extensive experience as a contractor and landlord. In light of this, I urge the LPC to work with the new owner quickly and efficiently to halt the deterioration and restore the building. I hope the LPC will establish contact with the new owner as quickly as possible in order to begin this long overdue process.

Thank you for your continued attention to this matter, and we look forward to hearing back from you or your staff.
